

JMRI Part 2 – Blocks, Routing and Signalling

Here are the details for the “JMRI Blocks, Routing and Signalling” course which will take place in the “Goods Shed” meeting room at the Rushden Transport Museum & Railway, Rushden Station, Northamptonshire, over the weekend 4th to 6th September 2021.

Please note that if you already have a booking for the 2020 course which could not take place, your booking will be honoured for this course in 2021, you do NOT need to book again. Please just let us know that you will be coming, so we can keep track of numbers.

This is part 2 of our three JMRI courses.

The course will run over the weekend with arrivals from 4pm on Friday afternoon 3rd September to about 5pm on Sunday afternoon 5th September.

For those who arrive on Friday evening from 4pm onwards, we can get ahead with updating JMRI, getting connected to the layout and reviewing what you hope to get from the course.

On Saturday and Sunday, the venue will be open from about 8am for tea, coffee and bacon butties, with the course starting at 9am on each day.

In addition to the weekend course, there is an optional follow-on practical workshop day on Monday 6th September. This day will be purely a practical workshop session for you to apply the knowledge learnt over the weekend, with the assistance of the tutors. If you have your own layout hardware that you want to work on with JMRI, we can also assist with that on the Monday.

Note that there will still be practical sessions during the main weekend, the all day Monday workshop is an additional option.

Your course tutors will be Pete Brownlow and Chris Noble. We will limit numbers to a maximum of 12 to make sure everyone gets good value from the weekend.

This is a weekend course for those already familiar and competent with the basics of JMRI.

As a pre-requisite, you should have attended our introduction to JMRI Panel Pro course, or be fluent and comfortable with drawing a layout diagram in the Layout Editor, setting up turnouts and sensors, turnout feedback, linking from a Layout Editor Panel to the physical layout and the basics of train detection.

Topics covered will include:

- Revision of block detection and train tracking
- Choosing where blocks start and end, which rails to detect
- Detecting trains on frogs and crossings
- Real vs virtual blocks
- Reporters – RFID
- Logix – “If this then do that”
- Entry-Exit (NX) routing
- Signal heads vs Signal Masts
- Setting up control of signals using signal masts – semaphore and colour light
- Signal mast logic (we will use BR 2003 rulebook signals for our examples)
- Signal feathers using Logix
- Approach control
- Customising signal mast icons
- Block routing
- Diving into JMRI XML files as and when we need to
- A brief look at scripting – write your own program within JMRI **

Don't worry if you don't know what some of the above means – you will by the end of the course!

** It is not a requirement for this course for you to be familiar with computer programming. Nor can we teach you computer programming in one weekend! So we will just look at the scripting facilities in JMRI and what can be achieved with them. We will provide information for you to find out more depending on your level of understanding of computer programming.

We will use CBUS as an example layout connection for practical sessions and demonstrations, but the principles learnt can be applied to using JMRI with any system.

If you have your own hardware, using CBUS or any other system, that you wish to use with JMRI, then please feel free to bring it along if you wish. However facilities will be provided for you to link in to our CBUS demo layout at the course, which may be preferable as the course material refers to the demo layout with example panel files for you to try.

This will be a practical course so that you can have a go on your own computer as we go along.

Full automation using scripts and/or the dispatcher are covered in our JMRI part 3 course – Automation, which is scheduled to run in November 2021.

The course fee is £115, including a buffet lunch in the RHTS buffet car on each full course day.

The fee for the optional extra Practical workshop day is £54, including a buffet lunch.

All you need to bring is your computer. A laptop is ideal. We can also accommodate a desktop computer, but you will need to bring your own screen, keyboard and mouse. JMRI will work on Windows, MAC or Linux.

For laptop users, please bring also bring a mouse as some of the operations in the JMRI layout editor are very fiddly to do using a touchpad.

For the Monday workshop session, feel free to bring any DCC command stations or layout control hardware that you would like to use with JMRI.
